

# President's Message

Dear Members,

The calendar says it is spring, snow piles are disappearing, and temperatures are warming up. With spring comes extended hours at the Resource Center and more activity on the streets downtown.

Work to re-do the west entrance of the Resource Center is underway, making our "back door" safer, more weather resistant, and definitely more appealing. Work has been going on in the Resource Center through cataloging collections and filling research requests.

The Light Station will open for the season early in June.

Our thanks to everyone who donated more than \$6,000 for the 2013-2014 annual fund drive. Expenses to operate the Resource Center and the Light Station are approximately \$5,000 per month, so we do appreciate any and all donations.

Authors Barb and Ken Wardius will be presenting the program for the April quarterly meeting on April 23. They will be talking about Wisconsin lighthouses, and their latest book will be available for purchase at the meeting. Please note that the meeting date has been moved a week later because of the Easter holiday.

Upcoming activities later this summer and fall will include a special event on June 21 at the Light Station, an open house for members on June 22, and a gala on October 24 that will replace our fall annual dinner.

After nearly two years of planning, construction has begun on the museum, Port Exploreum, in the 1907 Henry and Hill building at 118 N. Franklin Street. The Port Exploreum will bring together the



history of the area and the stories of its people interwoven with technology and engaging exhibits. The objective is to create a unique experience that will entice visitors to return again and again. The allotted space will be used creatively with information and exhibits that change over the year.

In conjunction with the PW Historical Society Board of Directors, the Port Exploreum Advisory Board has worked hard over the past 18 months to put together a plan for the museum. Stay tuned as the museum develops over the coming months. A donation form toward the Port Exploreum has been included in the newsletter. Consider how you might be a part of making this vision a reality.

As with any non-profit organization, we depend on the support of our members and friends. There are many ways you can help. Check out the list of volunteers needed and see if there is an area where you can help. As I have said often over these past years, "It is a great time to be a part of the PW Historical Society!"

# **VOLUNTEERS NEEDED**

Volunteers are needed for the Resource Center and Light Station.

### **Light Station:**

Guides are needed to lead small groups through the Port Washington 1860 lighthouse. Information and training are provided. The lighthouse is open Friday, Saturday and Sunday afternoons June through October. Two to four guides are needed on a given day. Guides are requested to be available two or more days a month. It's a great opportunity to meet visitors to the community.

### **Resource Center:**

Our building is open Monday, Thursday, and Friday 1-4 pm and Saturdays 10-2, spring through fall.

Greeters are needed in the exhibit areas to answer

questions and supervise the first floor areas and gift shoppe. Training is provided. Volunteers can perform archive work when there are no guests in the building.

Cleaning the building once a week is needed: vacuuming carpet and wood floors, dusting exhibit areas, cleaning the bathroom, and occasional window cleaning. You can choose a task.

Archive workers are needed to photocopy articles and photos, file photocopied items, catalogue information on collections, and file research requests.

Volunteers are needed to maintain databases of items in filing cabinets, shelves, and collections.

Special event planners are need to help create, organize, and stage a summer and fall event.

Volunteers comfortable with operating video cameras are needed to help record oral history interviews.

# **MUSEUM ADVISORY BOARD REPORT**

# Port Exploreum History to Celebrate – Our Future to Embrace

What's the Port Exploreum all about? That's a good question. Will it be a history museum... maritime museum... a children's museum? Will it be special?

While the answer to these questions is yes, yes, yes and yes, there is a more fundamental and compelling answer. First imagine connecting the past to the future through wonderful storytelling. These are the stories of our community; it's generations of families, the achievers, entrepreneurs, athletes, warriors, farmers, fishermen, seafarers – all who left their mark on our area's history are about to get a home in downtown Port Washington.



Upon entering, visitors will find themselves in a stunning two-story atrium.

Imagine a mysterious space with a surprise around every corner.

Imagine visionary exhibits, which are as much about the future as about the past.

Imagine a transformational experience where young children suddenly find themselves aboard an 1880 three-mast schooner sailing out of Port Washington.

In the Port Exploreum history will come alive in interactive displays, traveling exhibits, dramatic graphic presentations, and a children's maritime experience featuring cutting edge technology – all in a three-story building with a ship-like deck overlooking Lake Michigan.

Construction is moving along rapidly – on time and well within budget. The interior has been gutted, the roof work completed, windows installed, framing and rough electrical in place, and the lower level water-proofed.

# **Capital Campaign Launched**

The Society has announced the launch of a capital campaign with an overall goal of \$1,300,000 to complete the Port Exploreum. Yes, this is perhaps the biggest fundraising campaign ever seen in Port Washington. Already over \$400,000 has been donated or pledged leaving just \$900,000 to raised.

The \$400,000 recently raised includes \$200,000 from the Society and Advisory Board members, an anonymous gift of \$100,000 for the elevator, and generous gifts from the Ralph Huiras Foundation, WE Energies Foundation, and Duluth Trading.

A recent editorial in the *Ozaukee Press* stated, "While the museum is audacious in its challenges and conception, it is in keeping with the Historical Society's ability to overachieve in preserving and celebrating that which is most meaningful in the community's past."

The remaining \$900,000 to be raised includes:

- A 25% contingency/delay fund for unforeseen construction costs above the contractor's original bid. To date we have used little of these contingency dollars. Cross your fingers that his continues and we are able to deliver the Port Exploreum on time and within budget.
- Operating funds for the first 12 months after opening.
- Professional staffing.
- Cutting-edge technology and diverse media that will allow us to explore the stories of this community.
- Educational programming that not only coordinates with school curriculum, but also enlightens and entertains adults.
- Stunning public space available for special events and occasions.

# • New season begins Friday, June 6, 2014

We've changed our season opening and closing of the LS, which we hope will accommodate more tourists. Henceforth, we will open the first Friday in June and keep the LS open through the end of October. Hours of operation remain the same: Fridays – Noon to 4 pm, Saturdays – 11 am to 4 pm, and Sundays – Noon to 4 pm.

# • SOS from the LS

As most of our readers no doubt are aware, there is a very enthusiastic group that has united to "Save the Lighthouse" also known as "Save the Harbor" or "Save the Breakwater." Most folks refer to the Art Deco 1935 light at the end of the breakwater as the "lighthouse." However, its real designated title is pier head light or navigational light. NOT lighthouse. We are trying to clear up any confusion readers might have about what is being saved. Rest assured that the 1860 Light Station (or light house, if you will), is NOT in any danger or in any need of saving! What this group is referring to is the breakwater in the harbor and the 1935 Art Deco pier head light at the end of that structure.

# • Greeters and Tour Guides Needed

The need continues to find more volunteers to fill these positions at the LS. The more greeters and guides we sign on, the fewer hours each of our volunteers will have to fill in each month. We are happy to split shifts so no one needs to work a full 4- or 5-hour shift, if necessary. We are happy to accommodate volunteers who do not want to give tours to the tower/lantern room—some of our guides simply give tours of the first floor and then another guide takes over for the tower tour. 


In January a request came for someone from Arlington, Virginia, who wanted to tour the Light Station on February 14. Rick Smith responded that the Light Station is closed during the winter months and will be open for tours in May.


